## Extending tram services to Beeston and Chilwell





Works at the Queens Road East / University Boulevard Junction

From 8pm Friday 24 July for three weeks

## **Queens Road East / University Boulevard Junction**

Work to finish the junction of Queens Road East and University Boulevard will take place during part of the schools' summer holiday from 8pm on Friday 24 July for approximately three weeks.

Works will include construction of Severn Trent Water manholes in the centre of the junction. During this time we will need to introduce some temporary traffic restrictions for motorists and these are outlined below.

As the works are away from the new tram lines, trams will continue to run during this time, but the junction will need to be temporarily restricted to all other traffic so that the left turn from University Boulevard into Queens Road East and the straight on movement from Woodside Road into University Boulevard will remain open. All other routes at the junction will unfortunately need to temporarily close. Please see the map below for more details.

During this period we would advise motorists to use alternative routes if possible, but for those who continue to travel through the works, we would advise allowing extra time for journeys and due to the nature of the temporary traffic restrictions, be prepared to follow signed diversions from the A52 Clifton Boulevard, the A6005 Queens Road West or the A52 Derby Road.

Traffic diversions for residents in the immediate area will be signed so that local access can be maintained and access to Beeston Town Centre will continue to be available via Station Road, Wollaton Road and Broadgate and all shops and businesses will remain open as usual.

Some bus services which would normally travel through the junction may be diverted; please contact each operator for further details of their plans:

Access for residents' vehicles, access to the University of Nottingham's West Entrance and all pedestrian/cycle routes will be maintained.

While the works take place, there may be a need to close University Boulevard over a night to eastbound traffic, between Woodside and Queens Road East, but roadside signs will be displayed to give advance notice if this is necessary.

This work is being carried out during the schools' summer holidays to reduce the impact on the travelling public, but we're sorry for any inconvenience caused by the work and we would like to reassure you that we will do all that we can to keep disruption to a minimum.
